Christmas came early for us in 2020, with the news of Moody Logistics being awarded a significant contract by Danishbased Grundfos after we gained Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS) accreditation.

Grundfos, the world's largest manufacturer of water pumps, made it a condition we became a member of the voluntary scheme in order to transport its products to sites across the UK.

Paul Johnson our Operations and Compliance Manager worked diligently on the project which began early last year.

Speaking of our success he said, "It not only underlines our commitment to quality, but this award makes sound business sense – opening up new opportunities to compete for many more substantial contracts."

Work is now underway to meet even higher operational standards as part of our continuous business improvement scheme, as we progress towards achieving silver, then gold status.

Caroline Moody added: "Safety has always been at the heart of Moody Logistics, but being a FORS operator, demonstrates to our customers that we are exceeding industry standards in terms of safety and compliance and that enables us to stand out when competing for new business."



### ELIVERING CORONAVIRUS TEST KITS

As a direct result of achieving FORS bronze status, we also won a contract with Royal Mail to help deliver vital COVID-19 test kits to NHS Scotland.

Since starting the contract in late 2020 our team have worked 7 nights a week (aside from Christmas Day and New Year's

Day) collecting test kits from both Gateshead and Carlisle Royal Mail Centres, and delivering them promptly to the Queen Elizabeth University Hospital in Glasgow.
