HLC BOOST WITH BPW ACCREDITATION




Heathline Commercials is thrilled to have become a service centre for axle and suspension system manufacturer BPW.

We're also implementing driver improvements which look to reduce overall mileage by more efficient route planning, and already monitor drivers through our vehicle fleet management system to increase efficiency by switching off their engines when the truck is not in use and by

avoiding harsh braking and fast acceleration.

Caroline Moody, said: "We are constantly updating our fleet to ensure we operate the most fuel efficient trucks but by undergoing this green audit, it allows us to better understand our own carbon footprint so that we can further decarbonise our operations.

"Some of our corporate customers are now asking for the carbon tracking of the goods we deliver on their behalf, so I'm delighted that we are working with them to develop a process to do just that."
